Prof (Dr) Setlhomamaru Dintwe was appointed as the Inspector-General of Intelligence by the President of the Republic of South Africa. Prior to that, he was an Associate Professor of criminal and forensic investigations in the Department of Police Practice at the University of South Africa. He started his career in 1999 as a member of the South African Police Service stationed at Boitekong Detective Branch in Rustenburg as an Investigator. He was promoted to the position of Principal Investigator and transferred to the Anti-Corruption Command of the then Independent Complaints Directorate (ICD), now the Independent Police Investigative Directorate (IPID), in 2006. His responsibilities included investigating corrupt activities of members of the South African Police Service and the Municipal Police Service (Metro Police) nationwide. He was later promoted to the position of Provincial Manager: Investigations, where he headed the Investigation Component of the ICD in Nelspruit, Mpumalanga Province. Prof (Dr) Dintwe holds a Bachelor of Criminal Justice degree from North-West University, a Bachelor of Technology degree in Policing from Technikon Southern Africa, a Master of Technology degree in Forensic Investigations (he completed the coursework component meritoriously), and Doctor of Literature and Philosophy from the University of South Africa.

He received an award from the Policing Association of Southern Africa (POLSA) for best student in Policing matters in 2006. Prof (Dr) Dintwe is an accredited Assessor, Moderator, Facilitator of Learning, Skills Development Facilitator, and is certified as a Designer and Developer of Learning Programmes.

He served on the Marketing Committee of the College of Law, and coordinated the Departmental International Relations Desk.
